Labor

Do you support raising state and federal minimum wages? Yes. To what level? \$15 has been discussed.

What legislation would you support to make organizing unions easier? Legislation will not help as much as who is appointed to fill the Secretary of Labor position. This is why we need a Democrat in the White House.

Education

What is your opinion of high stakes testing? It's doesn't tell us what we wanted to know and it takes too much time away from TEACHING. Finance/Taxation

What would you do to facilitate implementation of public banking and monetary reform? Increase wages and increase the incentives to save.

How would you restructure the federal taxation system to address the growing problem of income inequality in America? Eliminate state dependence on sales tax and increase the income tax rate back to 50 then 60% for high incomes. Review (and eliminate) corporate tax breaks – to see which ones actually produce a benefit for the public. Development of a capital gains tax.

Health Care/Retirement

Explain your position (for or against) Medicare for All (aka single payer health care) in terms of the effect on local citizens, service providers, and government. I am supportive of expanding Medicare in a HMO style. A integrated health care system that will produce better outcomes of health with cheaper costs. Not to begin with but eventually will produce cheaper results.

What policies do you oppose and what polices would you promote with respect to Social Security and Medicare? Hard to say. I would have to look at it more closely.

Security/Public Safety
